

Facets of Hunger

Hunger has multiple faces and the causes of malnutrition include many social facets that can only be addressed if we work together. No matter the cause, the results can be drastic for body, mind, and spirit.

When a consistent source of food is not available, it is more dire than a sense of hunger and loss of weight—it is a **medical emergency**. Babies' malnourishment can limit brain development; children's education is thwarted; and adults' ability to function is stolen. Severe malnutrition will lead to disability or death.

The Daughters of Charity around the world help to prevent or improve situations of starvation in the groups they serve. Issues that represent the facets of malnutrition include natural disasters like droughts or floods, diseases like AIDS and cholera, war zones that destroy access and displace people ... but the major cause of malnutrition and starvation is POVERTY. Even in places where food is abundant, poverty is the barricade that holds people hostage.
