Building Abilities

In our country, there are resources available to assist people with disabilities. In poorly resourced areas of the world, a disability can be a death notice. Families who live in deep poverty cannot help their disabled family members and oftentimes, give up in despair and abandonment.

Our Sisters recognize the preciousness of each life, and offer lifelines to assist those with disabilities, their families, and their communities through many types of care:

- Hospitals and clinics provide treatments to save vision and provide mobility aids like braces, canes, and crutches.
- Schools integrate children with disabilities into their classrooms, provide them with rehabilitation activities, and often gather them into residency care and training programs to help them reach their full potential.
- Elderly persons without support receive home visits with food, medicine, and care or are gathered into safe, communal housing.

Providing necessary assistance to people with disabilities doesn't just help the individuals, it also supports families, and allows communities to benefit from the many talents and skills of all its members.
